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Furama City Centre

Furama City Centre lies in the heart of vibrant Chinatown, with a rich culture and long-standing history. Just within the vicinity, attractions, wide spectrum of dining options, entertainment and shopping are easily accessible on foot or by public transport. The exquisite, 445-room hotel is an urban oasis of comfort and impeccable service for business travellers, spirited staycationers and cosmopolitan voyager in a relaxed and cosy environment.

How to get there:

Walk to Changi Airport Station from Changi Airport, take the East-West Line towards Tanah Merah Station and alight at Expo Station. Change to the Blue Line (Downtown Line) towards Bukit Panjang Station and alight at Chinatown Station. Take Exit D and walk to the hotel.



Buddha Tooth Relic Temple

With its richly designed interiors and comprehensive exhibits, the temple is a symbol to Chinatown. Learn about the humble beginnings of this majestic temple which also houses a museum, as well as the Sacred Buddha Tooth Relic that is placed in a giant gold stupa.

How to get there:

Just a mere 10 minutes' walk away from our hotel, go on to Havelock Road, and Upper Pickering Street, turn right to South Bridge Road and make a U-turn at Spring Street. Finally, turn right at Sago Lane.

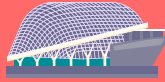


Gardens by the Bay

An oasis of lush greenery and floral displays, take a walk in the vibrant and futuristic park for a leisure stroll. Did you know that the movie Hitman was filmed at Gardens by the Bay?

How to get there:

Take the downtown line, alight at Bayfront station and take exit A.



Esplanade Theatres

With strong resemblance to the Durian fruit – also known as the King of Fruits in Singapore, Esplanade is home to local performing arts and theatre. Enjoy the tranquillity which surrounds and indulge in sumptuous food with a slew of cafes, restaurants and shops found along Esplanade.

How to get there:

A 15 minutes bus ride from People's Park Centre. Hop on to bus number 124/147/166/190 and alight at Stamford Ct. Walk about 10 minutes to Esplanade.



Merlion Park

The Merlion Park is one of the major tourist attractions and hosts one of Singapore's most prominent monuments. Half fish, half lion – this mythical hybrid creature symbolises Singapore's history. The fish tail and body signifies Singapore's old days as a small fishing town, whereas the head of the Merlion represents the very first name Singapura – which means 'lion city' in Malay. Surrounding the Merlion Park, take a stroll along the river bank and watch the sky turn a different shade of pinkish-orange in the evening.

How to get there:

Take bus number 51/2/12/33/61/63 at opposite Hong Lim Park and alight at Armenian Church. Walk about 15 minutes to the park.



Singapore River Cruise

Cruise along the waterway of Singapore River on iconic old-school bumboats and visit different landmarks scattered by the banks. Discover the rich culture and history behind these landmarks.

How to get there:

A short 10 minutes' walk, go past Eu Tong Sen Street and head on to Clarke Quay.

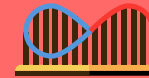


Singapore Flyer

Asian's largest ferris wheel, hope on the flyer and gaze over iconic and historical landmarks in Singapore. Get a view of the city skyline as well. Best recommended to go in the evening!

How to get there:

Take the downtown line at Chinatown train station, alight at Promenade Station 4 stops later and take exit A.



Universal Studio Singapore

Definitely a kid's favourite attraction – go on rides with different movie-inspired themes. Meet and greet mascots and enjoy a taste of that huge succulent Turkey leg! We would recommend for you to stay throughout the evening for a spectacular fire works display!

How to get there:

Hop on the Purple Line from Chinatown train station and alight at Harbourfront train station. Get on to level 3 of Vivocity, Lobby L, and take the Sentosa Express Line to Sentosa, Alight at Waterfront Station, 1 stop later.



Adventure Cove Waterpark

With the hot and sunny weather in Singapore, head to the water park for some fun under the sun! Experience high-speed thrilling water slides, float down the lazy river and come face-to-face with marine life!

How to get there:

Hop on the Purple Line from Chinatown train station and alight at Harbourfront train station. Get on to level 3 of Vivocity, Lobby L, and take the Sentosa Express Line to Sentosa, Alight at Waterfront Station, 1 stop later.
